EXPERT TIPS

MacGray shares long-held expertise based on nearly three decades of living in the region and running a business.

- How would you describe the current state of design? Colorado has transitioned to a mountain modern style over the last 10 years. It also has the challenges of designing for snow loads and the freeze-thaw process that happens throughout the winter-into-spring months.
- How does your company exemplify peak design practices?

We are a very collaborative company, working closely throughout the design process with the architects to ensure that the final product fits not only the desired aesthetic, but also the budget.
